DRESS RULES

On the Course

- The only acceptable standard of dress for gentlemen will be golf shirts with collars or polo/turtle neck and with sleeves. Shirts should be tucked into trousers or shorts at all times. Acceptable dress for ladies are golf tops with a collar or polo/turtle neck, with or without sleeves, and may be worn outside of trousers and shorts where designed to be worn that way. Blue denim clothing, training shoes, track suits, emblazoned shirts and football type tops are not allowed.
- Shorts may be worn on the course provided they are tailored and the length is a maximum of three inches above the knee. Gentlemen will be expected to wear short white sports socks above the ankle or knee length stockings with shorts. Ladies may wear ankle socks.
- The tucking of trousers (including waterproofs) into socks is not acceptable unless covered by over trousers or waterproofs. Headwear must be worn the way it was intended.
- All members and guests are expected to use the changing facilities provided. With the exception of changing shoes and putting on and removing waterproofs, changing in the car park is not permitted.

In the Clubhouse and Patio Areas

- Smart casual dress is expected to be worn by all members and guests. Blue denim clothing, training shoes, track suits, emblazoned shirts and football type tops are not allowed. Members and guests may wear clothing they have played in, but not over trousers or waterproofs, providing it is not unduly soiled. Due care should be taken of the furniture.
- Golf shoes and headwear shall not be worn in the clubhouse other than in the locker rooms. Hats may be worn on the patio area. At all times appropriate outdoor footwear shall be worn. For all members no flip-flops are allowed and for gentlemen members no sandals without socks are permitted.
- Members and guests shall not use any designated dining area wearing clothes in which they have just played golf except if dining between two rounds of golf or in open competitions when indicated as permissible on notices and entry forms for such events.

At Competitions, Matches, Club Functions, and Social Events

- All members and guests receiving prizes shall change from their golf clothes. Gentlemen members and guests will be expected to wear jacket and tie. Those not complying may not be presented with prizes. This may be varied for certain competitions but this will be clearly indicated on notices and entry forms for such events.
- At Annual General Meetings and Extraordinary General Meetings, all members are requested to attend in appropriate clothing. All gentlemen members attending are required to wear jacket and tie. The wearing of shorts is not permitted.
- At all internal club competitions and matches against other clubs (other than League and Inter-Club matches), all members are expected to change from their golf clothes before dining in any designated dining area. Gentlemen members and guests will be expected to wear jacket and tie.
- Dress rules for Club Functions and Social Events will be posted on the notice of the event. Members and guests are expected to conform to these requirements.
- At all events the dress rules may be relaxed by the Captain or appropriate organiser on the day according to circumstances e.g. hot weather.

MOBILE PHONE USE

- The use of mobile phones is not permitted on the golf course, in the clubhouse or locker rooms, except in emergencies. The use of mobile phones is allowed in specific designated areas, i.e., the main entrance hall, any enclosed office or near to the public telephone. Please ensure they are switched off when entering the club.

The club secretary, bar manager, members of the committee and the professionals will request that anyone not complying with the dress and mobile phone code should change, cease using phones or be asked to leave. With the co-operation of you all, no one will be inconvenienced.
